MAT students must choose one content teaching field from the list of state-approved teaching fields. 24 hours of content coursework is required; 21 hours may be transferred in from the student's baccalaureate degree major; 12 hours must be upper-level.

## **Degree and Certification Requirements**

- The MAT degree consists of 36 credit hours. All coursework must be completed at the graduate level (500 or higher).
- All courses must be completed with a grade of B- or better to receive credit.
- Maintain a 3.0 (B) grade point average (GPA) for all courses counted toward the degree.
- Passing scores on the Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA) exam or meet exemption.
- Satisfactory completion of 45 hours of field-based experience in local secondary schools, in conjunction with course work.
- Satisfactory results on background and fingerprint checks.
- Complete and present a portfolio in the last semester of Internship.
- Pass appropriate TExES exams.
- Apply for Texas State certification when all requirements are completed.
- Students should refer to the General Announcements for additional information and degree requirements.
